In addition to our existing partnerships with the Southern League and Florida State League, we designed, constructed and delivered our wooden A-frame signs featuring America's missing children to the Kane County Cougars of the Midwest League, the Akron RubberDucks of the Eastern League, and the entire New York-Penn League. Our grand total at year's end 2015 was 278 missing children featured, and 65 found! Wow!

We added Ellen Sullivan to our roster as our new CEO this season. She brings to BairFind a winning business background, and sound fundamentals. Among her many achievements, her work this year resulted in **The BairFind Foundation earning Gold Medal status in nonprofit transparency from GuideStar!**

Finally in December, we attended the annual Baseball Winter Meetings in Nashville, Tennessee. As a result of our work in the search for missing children, we were invited to partner with Minor League Baseball as an official charity, and we have been granted the **special designation of a "Homegrown" Charity Partner**. That means that we will be working with MiLB Charities to expand nationwide for the 2016 season.



Milb has approved The BairFind Foundation as an official Milb "Homegrown" Charity and the New York Yankees adopted BairFind throughout the entire Minor League system.






Prior to the stadium concourse signs, BairFind started out by having poster giveaways at various minor league base-ball games with inset missing children profiles. One of those children was Gina DeJesus. Gina was featured on team posters, stadium signs and BairFind's website for many years. Founder Dennis Bair worked closely with the DeJesus family in their search. He arranged for first pitch ceremonies with Gina's family in area minor league base-ball parks. By doing so, it helped to keep Gina and another missing girl, Amanda Berry, profiles in public view and in the news media.

In 2013, a major breakthrough occurred when Gina, Amanda and another woman were successfully rescued from a Cleveland home where they held in captivity for over a decade. Their story is told in the New York Times Best Seller "Hope: A Memoir of Survival in Cleveland".

In 2015, it was a very exciting summer as the DeJesus Family accompanied Dennis to games at the Akron Rubber-Ducks and Mahoning Valley Scrappers. This time, Gina herself, threw the ceremonial first pitch while the crowd cheered.

Gina told Dennis and the news media "I was nervous at first but I saw my mother do it {throw the first pitch} when I was in captivity."
